<p>Policy Superior High School</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Prom & Fall Ball</p> <p>Attendance Requirement: Students must be in attendance a minimum of 90% of the school days to attend the Fall Ball or Prom. For Fall Ball, the attendance rate will be calculated from September 10 through October 5. For Prom, attendance will be calculated from September 10 through April 5.</p> <p>The following reasons for being absent will <u>not</u> be factored into the 90% attendance rate:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ●Dentist or Doctor Appointments (provided the attendance office receives verification from the doctor). ●Illness (provided the attendance office receives verification from the doctor). ●Bereavement ●Participation in school activities ●Religious Holidays <p>Guests are welcome at the Prom and Fall Ball with the following stipulations:</p> <p><u>Fall Ball</u> Guest must currently be enrolled in high school. (must provide verification form with signature from the principal) The Fall Ball is open to students in grades 9 through 12.</p> <p><u>Prom</u> The guest must be less than 21 years of age. The guest must currently be: 1. attending high school or</p>		

- 2. is a high school graduate and is currently attending a post-secondary institution (must provide verification form with signature from the post-secondary institution)**
- 3. or is currently employed (must provide verification form with signature from the employer)**

The Prom is open to students in grades 11 and 12. A Superior High School student in grade 11 or 12 may bring a guest who is in grade 10. The Prom is not open to 9th grade students.

NOTE: Guests may be subject to a background check.
Requests for approval of guests must be submitted in writing to the principal a minimum of two weeks prior to the dance. Approval must be granted before purchasing a ticket for the dance.
